## **Background**

As of September 1, 2016, pursuant to Bylaw 3.1.12, all Fellows, Associates, and Affiliates who are not claiming a waiver of dues as fully retired are required to disclose to the Executive Director of the Institute any criminal conviction of which he or she has been the object within 30 days following the criminal conviction.

Section 8 of the <u>Policy on Disclosure of Criminal Convictions</u> requires that members be regularly advised of the results of the criminal conviction disclosure assessments conducted by the PCMB.

## Report

The following criminal conviction was disclosed to the Executive Director and assessed by the PCMB during the period of January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2020:
